Cracking Codes: Cryptology for Kids

Dates: January 15- March 12, 2014 (8 weeks)


Objective: Students will learn the language of spies and secret agents in this children's cryptology class. Cryptology is the science of secret writing which uses math and reasoning such as number patterns, sequences, and symbols to create and decode mystery alphabets. Each week students will learn one or more ciphers and will practice using them to write coded messages to each other and to decode class examples. Code systems used in Quarter 3 will include the Navajo Code, the scytale, and various transposition and substitution ciphers. This class is not a repeat of cryptology classes from Fall 2013 and may be taken without prerequisites.
