By sharing samples from the family's homeschool resources and materials, parents can provide a more thorough and well-rounded picture of their child's academic progress throughout the year. Following is a suggested list of materials that a parent or guardian should bring to their evaluator meeting. It is understood that not all families will have all of these items, and all suggestions are "if applicable."

Compass Classes

- No records needed. The evaluator will have a list of your child's Compass classes at the evaluation meeting.

Get to Know You

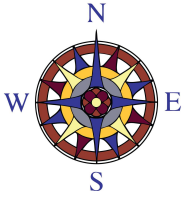
- Favorite toy or collectible (younger children)
- Favorite book or photo/sample of hobby (older children, teens)

Math

- Math workbook or textbook with completed units and sections
- Completed math worksheets, quizzes, or tests
- Examples of solved problems or math journals
- Digital records from online math apps like *Prodigy Math* or *DreamBox*

English Language Arts (ELA)

- Reading comprehension workbook, textbook, or articles
- Reading logs or book lists with dates
- Sample sentences, paragraphs, book reports, essays, or short stories
- Journal entries, creative writing samples, poetry
- Writing rubrics
- Vocabulary or spelling lists
- Grammar exercise book



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Science

- Science textbook or lab book
- Lab reports, science project summaries
- Diagrams, drawings, and experiment logs
- Completed worksheets or activities
- Photos or videos of science experiments
- Project-based learning work (e.g., building a volcano, growing crystals)

Social Studies

- Written reports, history timelines, maps
- Notes or journals from history lessons
- Essays or papers on historical figures/events
- Record of field trips related to history, museums, or historical sites

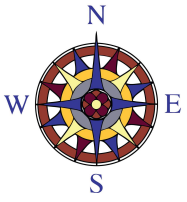
Foreign Language

- Records or syllabuses from *Duolingo*, *Rosetta Stone*, or similar (online programs)
- Vocabulary lists, conjugation charts, dialogue scripts
- Reading comprehension exercises
- Recorded audio/video of language practice

General Homeschool Documentation for the Meeting:

- Any grade reports or transcripts from outside or online programs
- Digital records from online learning platforms
- Outside or independent evaluations
- Any standardized testing results
- Learning goals and objectives
- Documentation or photos of field trips, extracurricular activities, volunteer work, parttime jobs, etc.

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
